Fiduciary/Crime Bond Insurance

Under Article VI, Section I in The American Legion National Constitution & By-laws, states "All national employees and volunteers handling all American Legion monies and negotiable instruments shall be

covered by fidelity/crime insurance in an adequate amount as desired by the Finance Commission and said fidelity/crime insurance policy (s) shall be approved by the National Treasurer, National Judge Advocate and Finance Commission."

To help meet this requirement, The American Legion has a relationship with NFP Insurance Agency to assist each department and post with a fiduciary/crime bond insurance to protect individuals and members against financial loss. This insurance program through NFP Insurance Agency is recommended, not required, to allow American Legion members to purchase fiduciary/crime bond insurance through a purchasing group provided by NFP Insurance Agency using Chubb Insurance Paper. The program was developed to assist domestic and international locations.

Download the required American Legion Scheduled Position Crime Policy application at legion.org/documents/pdf/Crime-American Legion Questionnaire.pdf. This is needed to bind coverage and the cost associated with the levels of insurance needed. All information needed to obtain this coverage through our group purchasing program is provided on the application.

- 50% by September 1st, 2021
- 75% by October 15th, 2021. All Posts receiving this goal will receive a "Quick Draw Award.
- 100% by December 31st, 2021
- "Race To The Top" deadline by March 31st, 2022. Note: 11th District was at 114.9% and my Post was at 157%. Every Post and District can achieve this. Good luck everyone.

On September 11th, Department Commander Jerry Brandt, Vice Commanders Eunice Butts, Michael "Gambler" Raymond, and Chris Hamrick along with Membership Chairman Bruce Thurber provided training in the Southern Area at Post 142 in Pompano Beach. Membership Retention

As we enter the Holiday Season, we need to go Full Steam Ahead with membership. Every American Legion post should have a plan in place to coordinate and direct membership development. The post

commander, ultimately, is responsible for the success or failure of the post to meet its membership goals for the year. Often, the post membership chairman assists the commander by selecting membership team members, planning membership rallies or events, and assisting the commander and adjutant with processing new and renewed members.

Commanders often follow a formula for success by assigning an energetic and motivated Legionnaire to be the Post Membership Officer (or chairman) to supervise the following post membership teams:

- 1. Retention
- 2. Recruiting
- 3. Revitalization

We need to begin with 90% retention.

Membership retention Month begins

November 1st. The Retention team

specializes in persuading current and former Legionnaires to renew membership in the post. They use post membership rosters and historical data to identify non-renewed members and contact each member personally to address concerns and get a favorable renewal decision.

Next, we need to recruit new members. Recruiting is an ongoing team effort led by the Post Membership Chairman. **The New Member recruiting team** specializes in convincing eligible prospects to join the post. Team members should be persuasive speakers who are comfortable talking with people, especially strangers, and proven "go-getters" with good working knowledge of the Legion, its organization, purpose, history, and services. This team also compiles names, addresses, and telephone numbers for eligible prospects who would not join the post.

Our third team is the Revitalization Team. The **Revitalization team** should restrict itself to building a list of areas and neighborhoods where potential members might be. The membership chairman coordinates specific events to host in these local communities throughout the year with post leaders. Post leaders might also prepare plans and make necessary arrangements for post-sponsored events scheduled on the post calendar. Such events could include an Americanism rally,

fireworks, a post membership breakfast or dinner, a post open house, an American Legion birthday party, a dance, a children's day, a Halloween carnival, a fun-run marathon competition, a tractor-pull competition, Legion Rider fun runs, and a talking Christmas Tree or Santa Claus hotline for children.

District Team efforts are building membership in the district's weak posts or newly chartered posts in need of growth to develop and sustain its programs and the American Legion home.

District officers select the district membership chairman and members for the three district teams. This role is vital, so it's essential to choose the best workers from across the district.

District leaders and district membership chairman choose the posts needing help and, with the help of the Department Post Development Chairperson, the contact method to employ and the calendar of events, as well as planning and organizing the events themselves.

Ron Neff said Every Legionnaire a Recruiter, "By my example, and through passion and conviction, I will inspire all veterans to continue their noble service to this great

have a home post. Are you going to keep them out from fear of not knowing them? They deserve to have a warm embrace and a handshake. Seek them out and invite them into your posts family.

Has your Post submitted at least one report to their up-level leadership? Your District Commander, Area Commander, Zone Commander, then to your respective membership Chair (East or West) that would forward it to our Department Commander (Jerry Brandt). It is much like your CPR gathering tho data to finally arrive at the Department Commander. You will find it at Floridalegion.org under the Resources Column. Go to forms & documents, then to Membership Resources, then to DMS Activity Report. It is in a PDF, so you can fill out all the sections and then send it on its way to your next level up.

Amanda Bass Brown is my niece. She is an ICU RN down in South Florida. I am very proud of her and all of our first responders. They have been through Heart Ache in the last two years during the

Covid-19 Pandemic. Therefore I felt that it was appropriate to post what these Angels of Mercy have to look forward to during their shift.

Time: The sedative was given. Time: The paralytic was given. Time: The patient was intubated. Time: Their Central line was placed. Time: Their arterial line was placed. Time: Their Vas Cath was placed.

Time: CRRT initiated.

Time: The patient is brought to prone

position.

Time: The ABG was drawn. Time: The family is notified. Time: The Zoom meeting is set up. Time: The family is allowed to say their

goodbyes.

Time: Time of death.

That was someone's mother, father, spouse, brother, sister, aunt or uncle, or good friend.

I've stood outside a patient's room with clasp hands, giving a thumbs up to a patient through a window as they were being extubated. Moments before.

"Stay calm," the respiratory therapist is going to take this breathing tube out," Okay? "I need you to nod your head if you understand me. I know, don't try to talk, Your doing

I've taught patients to call when they were ready to be intubated. Days of being on BiPAP on long. 100% Oxygen can only be adequate for so long. They get tired.

"I can't breath."

"Okay, let me get the Doctor and get everything ready."

"Tell my kids I love them."

"Tell them yourself we are calling them in before this happens."

"Please make sure I come off the ventilator." "Listen to me, you fight like heck, Okay"? "How am I supposed to fight when I am

fighting falling asleep?"

"You just have to go into this knowing you want to fight. You will never be alone. We will fight this with you".

"They pass away, and there is nothing more in our power that can help them."

To: Nurses, Doctors, Nurse Practitioners, Respiratory Therapist, Pharmacist, CNAs, PCTs, Phlebotomist, RAD, CT Techs, and anyone else that I've missed.

How many times do we go home holding on to any bit of hope that what we are doing is making a difference for these patients?

Go home, and come back only to find out the patient didn't make it.

All those times we felt like we weren't doing anything for these patients-you chance is here.

If you have even the SLIGHTEST bit of opportunity to prevent contracting this virus and giving it to others-take it.

Do it for the patients you've lost. For some, you were the last person they spoke with, the last hand they held.

Blind Kayak Angler in SWFL



George Tice joined the Army in October 1986 as an Army Reserve. He was called to active duty in 1990 for Operation Desert Shield

then Desert Storm. On March 1, 1991, just as the war was ending, he was involved in a helicopter crash that went down near the unit compound. Tice pulled the only survivor from inside the fiery wreckage

amongst explosive ordinances and got the young PFC to safety to render first aid. The young soldier told Tice that it was a five-person crew. Tice left the soldier with another person from his unit and started searching. At this time, other soldiers began showing up to help. The Pilot was deceased, but the Co-Pilot was in bad shape. Tice came across another soldier laying down face first in the sand. He turned him over to find him deceased. He recovered his body and moved it back to the crash site. After the fire was put out, the Saudi Arabia Fire Department recovered the last body.

Tice got out in May of 1991 and was having issues with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder from the crash. Tice was given the Army Achievement Medal with the letter V attached for Valor.

Tice needed something to release the stress, so he took up fishing, but living in Pennsylvania, he was two hours from the New Jersey Shore. After moving his family to Fort Myers in 1991, he started a veterans fishing group called Vets Luv Fishing. He would find local captains to donate their

time and gas to take veterans out fishing. In 1994 he had the first stroke that left him with PinPoint Vision loose in one eye. In December of 2016, he had a couple of powerful strokes and was in a coma. Then in January 2017, he had some more strokes and went in for Open Heart Surgery. The doctor told Tice that he had never worked on someone with so much brain damage that he might wake up blind. After the surgery, he was in another coma, and his family said that that was the best he might

be. After three days, he woke up blind. In 2018 he joined a veteran group called Heroes on the Water of Southwest Florida. Only one thing was they fished from kayaks. So after spending the day with them, he went out and purchased his kayak. Tice hasn't looked back from fishing in tournaments when he can find someone to fish with him.

Tice has been part of Post 38 and has been the Second Vice and now the First Vice for the last two years. Tice's short-term goal is to become the first Blind Post Commander in American Legion history.


